Crafting some warmth

Girl Scout knits hats for newborns

MURFREESBORO —

When Emma McLaughlin received knitting looms for her birthday, she was excited to practice a new craft.

The 12-year-old began knitting hats for babies, and soon an idea struck. As a member of the Girl Scouts, McLaughlin needed a community project to earn her Silver Award. She contacted local emergency medical services to see if they knew anyone who needed baby hats, and they did.

"The state requires that each ambulance be stocked with three infant hats at all times," says Terry Cunningham, community relations coordinator for the Rutherford County Emergency Medical Service. "Previously I've had to buy them at Walmart, so this saves the county money."

In fact more babies are born at home due to emergencies than you might expect, and those infant hats are necessary to keep the newborn warm

on its way to the hospital.

"Oh, my gosh, this is wonderful. Now there is a story behind each hat because they are handmade with love," Cunningham says.

It took McLaughlin about six or seven months to make more than 75 hats for the 24 ambulances in Rutherford County.

"I would work on them after school, on the weekends, whenever I had free time," McLaughlin says, adding that each one took about an hour or so to complete.

Yarn was donated to McLaughlin's cause by her mom and great-grandmother, who also knit and first inspired her to try the craft.

"Not only did I have to do a community project for my Silver Award, I had to involve other people as well, so I taught others to knit the hats," McLaughlin says. "I had to teach them how to loop it, how to tie (the hat) up, and I even showed them how to take two strings together and make the yarn thicker."

McLaughlin showed her school friends and fellow Girl Scouts as well

as her aunts and cousins.

"My hope is to keep doing the hats for the EMS ambulances, but it also is to let people know there is a need for these baby hats," she says.

If you would like to help McLaughlin and her cause, you can knit baby hats for the EMS.

"Hats can be knitted, crocheted or knitted on a loom," McLaughlin says.

EXPLANATION FOR ABOVE AMENDMENT REQUEST

We received \$16,000 from the Rutherford County Emergency Communications District for use in training our dispatchers. These funds are designated to pay for classes and to pay for overtime or PRN coverage while personnel attend these classes. We are requesting to transfer \$1,500 into our in-service line item to cover dispatchers' classes.

Second amendment transfers \$20,000 from Paraprofessionals to cover the costs for communications for the remainder of the fiscal year. O.I.T. has been paying for our circuit boards this fiscal year. We owe them \$10,700 from July 1st through March 31st. AT&T's costs continue to rise every month.
