

**RUTHERFORD COUNTY, TENNESSEE

The Rutherford County Correctional Work Center Board met for their monthly board meeting on Monday, May 13, 2013.

A) MEETING CALLED TO ORDER

Chairman Ernest Burgess called the meeting to order at 8:30 am.

C) APPROVE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

Mrs. Mosby moved that the minutes of the April 1, 2013 meeting be approved as published. Seconded by Mr. Asbury. The motion carried unanimously with favorable votes.

D) REPORT OF EXPENDITURES

The Board was presented with the litter pickup report, budget spreadsheet, account analysis report, the yearly activity report, general session bills, ABL and IC Solutions commission reports, and the monthly worker report. Superintendent noted there were more issues with the chiller and additional bills from Nashville Machine. A majority of the bill submitted by Nashville Machine is for labor. He is working with Nashville Machine to get these bills reduced. Staff is looking into upgrading the DVRs to go digital in the near future. The budget lines are getting low considering we are close to the end of the fiscal year, but with no unexpected needs we should be all right. After discussion, Mr. Hartley moved that Report of Expenditures be approved. Seconded by Mrs. Mosby. The motion carried unanimously with favorable votes. After further discussion, Mr. Asbury moved that the Board endorse the concept of replacing the DVRs subject to final review. Seconded by Mr. Gammon. The motion carried unanimously with favorable votes.

E) OTHER BUSINESS, IF ANY

Superintendent Salandy noted the workhouse's average number of inmates stays around 180. We can hold up to 64 females. If the mental health grant goes through we will be able to take more inmates in the future.

Captain Cope noted on May 28 at 6 pm Marcus Weaver, a survivor of the July 2012 shooting at a theater in Aurora, Colorado, will be giving his testimony to our inmates. Everyone is invited to attend. Captain Cope also stated on May 20 there will be a community care project involving some of our female inmates. They will help clean up the pauper's graveyard.


Superintendent Salandy noted the work release program is running smoothly. We have just partnered with Interlap Pallet Company in Murfreesboro. They will begin employing two of our inmates.

Superintendent also noted a pre-audit is coming up in June. Staff will be doing some major and minor cleaning around the building to prepare for the audit.

He also noted the GED classes are running smoothly. As soon as one class is over another class starts. Our current GED teacher, Dr. Bakari is also a full-time professor at MTSU and conducts GED classes at the Rutherford County Jail. He is very dedicated to assisting the inmates obtain their GEDs.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 9:15am.




