





The Rutherford County Correctional Work Center Board met for their monthly board meeting on Monday, June 3, 2013.

A) MEETING CALLED TO ORDER

Chairman Ernest Burgess called the meeting to order at 8:40 am.

B) ROLL CALL

C) APPROVE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

Mr. Asbury moved that the minutes of the May 13, 2013 meeting be approved as published. Seconded by Mrs. Mosby. The motion carried unanimously with favorable votes.

D) REPORT OF EXPENDITURES

The Board was presented with the litter pickup report, board bill, yearly activity report, ABL and IC Solutions commission reports, the monthly worker report, and a proposed budget amendment to move \$18,500 out of line 101-54220-399, other contracted services into lines 101-54220-709, data processing equipment (\$14,000) and 101-54220-441, prisoner clothing (\$4,500). Superintendent and OIT staff are still working out the DVR details. The inmate clothing allowance will replace the t-shirts the inmates currently wear with tops made of a more durable material and replace some of the jeans. Also, Superintendent noted he is still working with Nashville Machinery on the bills for repair of the chillers. Mr. Hartley moved that Report of Expenditures be approved. Seconded by Mrs. Mosby. The motion carried unanimously with favorable votes. After further discussion, Mr. Asbury moved that the budget amendments be approved subject to final review with OIT regarding the DVRs or delete the DVR budget amendment, if OIT

doesn't recommend. Seconded by Mrs. Mosby. The motion carried unanimously with favorable votes.

E) OTHER BUSINESS, IF ANY

Superintendent noted there will be an inmate cookout and music. On Saturday, There will be approximately one hundred and fifty inmates and family members to attend. An ex-inmate is furnishing the band. The Board was invited to attend.

Superintendent noted there is a staff appreciation event on Saturday, June 8 from 12:30 to 4:30 at the Lane Agri Park. There will be food, inflatable games, face painting and special activities. The Board was invited to attend.

Sunday, June 9, New Vision is opening up a new chapel and has invited the inmates for the grand opening. The inmates were invited to attend.

Mayor Burgess commended Superintendent for receiving the Superintendent of the Year Award. The Board was proud of this accomplishment.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 9:15am.

The Rutherford County Correctional Work Center Board met for their monthly board meeting on Monday, July 1, 2013.

A) MEETING CALLED TO ORDER

Chairman Ernest Burgess called the meeting to order at 8:35 am.

B) ROLL CALL

C) APPROVE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

Mr. Hartley moved that the minutes of the June 3, 2013 meeting be approved as published. Seconded by Mrs. Mosby. The motion carried unanimously with favorable votes.

D) REPORT OF EXPENDITURES

The Board was presented with the litter pickup report, board bill, yearly activity report, ABL and IC Solutions commission reports, the account analysis and budget spread sheet. Superintendent Salandy noted there were two budget amendments moving \$7,660 from line 101-54220-399, other contracted services into the sergeant salary and benefits lines (\$7060) and in-service training line (\$600). After discussion, Mrs. Mosby moved that the Report of Expenditures be approved. Seconded by Mr. Gammon. The motion carried unanimously with favorable votes.

E) OTHER BUSINESS, IF ANY

Superintendent reported that Doors of Hope and New Vision Baptist Church are looking into transitional homes for the inmates. The workhouse staff is giving advice only.

Superintendent noted the employee family cookout held at Lane Agri-Park was a success. There was a good turnout and we have heard positive feedback.

Superintendent noted that we will have another Volunteer Appreciation Banquet in September. He is actively searching for a sports figure to participate and give their testimony. With the help of the volunteers and staff the recidivism in our community is about 30%. The recidivism used to be around 80% for this community.

Superintendent stated that medical reasons keeps us from getting some inmates, but he hopes that will eventually change with the Volunteer Behavioral Health Grant.

Mayor Burgess noted we may owe Dr. Rudd over and above the monthly amount we currently pay. Dr. Rudd will generate a full report through the end of June and then the Mayor can determine the amount owed Dr. Rudd. Mayor noted that the workhouse staff is pleased with the medical services.

Mr. Gammon inquired as to where we stand with the DVR system. Superintendent noted he had spoken with Brian Robertson in OIT and he said the service on the equipment is too vague and doesn't recommend going forward at this time. Mr. Gammon noted the Sheriff's Department may go to a facility in Kentucky to see this DVR system and to ask questions. He invited Superintendent to go with them.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 8:50 am.
