

In an effort to expand our health planning and improve the overall quality of patient care and well-being in our community, we are writing to request your collaboration, facilitation and resources in formally collecting and sharing Rutherford County EMS data.

Hospitals and healthcare providers, including TriStar StoneCrest and St. Thomas Rutherford, could use this information in the following ways:


- Identify and address emergent services not readily available in Rutherford County
- Reduce time-to-intervention for critical care patients by evaluating the care continuum
- Identify areas of high utilization/low access for emergent/urgent health services
- Develop community health and wellness education programs
- Evaluate potential hospital/EMS collaborations for future care models
- Recognize and anticipate trends in patient care so the emergency systems can grow in a resource efficient manner
- Facilitate comparison of data with other systems
- Provide insight in resources needed to move toward a model of wellness and prevention and away from injury and emergent episodes

To accomplish this, we would suggest the following data points, with unique patient identifiers when possible, on a quarterly basis:


- Number of EMS station, by zip code
- Hospital or other Healthcare Provider Destination
- Destination Determination
- Primary Diagnosis Code and/or Principle Procedure Code and/or Incident/Patient Disposition and/or Provider Impression and/or Injury Description
- Response Times: Dispatch notification, Response Times, and subsequent arrival time at hospital emergency department (when applicable)
- Hospitals would provide time to provider and intervention for certain patient critical patient population (i.e. tPA administration, door to balloon time, trauma, etc.).
- Patient Age, Gender, Race/Ethnicity
- Mode of Transport (Flight vs. Ambulance vs. Convalescent)
- "Back In Service" Time after a hospital/healthcare provider transport

Your support of this request is greatly appreciated. We would welcome the opportunity to meet with you to discuss this in more detail. We foresee this endeavor as one of collaboration between the hospitals and EMS, and are willing to support this in any way possible.
