The representative from Rogers Group inquired if the other two bidders included a Drug-Free Workplace Affidavit? He referenced TCA 50-9-114 which requires each employer with no less than 5 employees receiving pay who contracts with the state or any local government to provide construction services to submit an affidavit stating that such employer has a drug-free workplace program that complies with Title 50, Chapter 9, of the Tennessee Code Annotated.

The other two bidders did not include this affidavit with their bid and Mr. Burgess said he will check to see if this affidavit is required and, if so, ask the successful bidder to furnish it.

Del Corbitt recommended awarding the low bid to Hawkins Asphalt Paving subject to receipt from them of their Drug-Free Workplace Affidavit.

"Commissioner Gooch moved, seconded by Commissioner Black, to award the low bid to Hawkins Paving subject to receipt from them of their Drug-Free Workplace Affidavit. The motion passed unanimously."


