Chairman Burgess presided and called the meeting to order with six members present.

AMBULANCES – EMS

One bid was received from Northwestern Emergency Vehicles in the amount of \$114,973.00 each. Scotty Blackburn said they plan to purchase two of these which are gas vehicles instead of diesel. This amount is under what was budgeted so he and Brian Gaither recommended awarding the bid to Northwestern Emergency Vehicles.

Three bids were received:

1. Heritage Cleaners - 3 uniforms per week (pants & shirts) \$2.00 each
Certificate of Insurance was attached as requested in specs.
2. Holiday Cleaners – 3 uniforms per week (pants & shirts) \$1.90 each
(No Certificate of Insurance included.)
3. A-1 Dry Cleaners – 2 uniforms per week (pants & shirts) \$1.95 each
Certificate of Insurance was attached as requested in specs.

Upon a review of the bids, it was determined that A-1 Dry Cleaners used an old set of specs and only bid 2 uniforms per week instead of the current 3 uniforms per week. Holiday Cleaners, who submitted the low bid, did not include proof of insurance with their bid as requested. Heritage Cleaners was the only one who met all bid specifications although they are the highest bidder. Following much discussion, the following motion was made:


